

The Annual Report of BUITEMS for the year 2012


was launched on August 21, 2013 in a press conference held at the Training Hall, Takatu Campus. Media Personnel from various TV channels and News papers, deans of faculties, directors and other academic and administrative staff attended the event. They were briefed about the decade long journey of the University and its aims and objectives. The year 2012 was an all-important year for BUITEMS. It marked the decade celebrations for the University and brought with it a surge of national and international recognition through awards and acknowledgments. The media personnel were briefed about the milestones BUITEMS has achieved so far and the domains where BUITEMS has made effective contribution along with the future plans of the University. The participants were briefed on faculty development program of the University, returning PhD and MS scholars, development projects completed and in progress, financial assistance provided to the students through scholarships, fee waivers and work & study programs and research output by BUITEMS scholars. They were informed about establishment of Business Incubation Center and importance of Endowment Fund. The message conveyed at the event was that BUITEMS is an organization cooperating in social and academic activities. The participants showed keen interest in the development of the University.



A question answer session followed the presentation. Mr. Ahmed Farooq Bazai, Vice Chancellor BUITEMS responded to the queries of the participants. He apprised the participants on admission policy of the University, financial resources and constraints, security issues related with students and the staff, and that every third student of BUITEMS avails

financial assistance in one form or the other. He emphasized that no student admitted in the university is denied access to quality education because of weak financial background. He acknowledged the support extended by HEC, Provincial Government, Governors' Secretariat, provincial ministers and other donors who have been extending cooperation for development of the university, and financial assistance of the students. In this connection, he specifically mentioned the generous contribution by Ms. Raheela Durrani for financing the construction of auditorium and sports complex. He expressed his hope

Proceedings

The training objectives were conveyed by Dean of FICT. The session started with the presentation of Dr. Jan Muhammad who introduced *the* **Endnote**: a commercial reference management software package, used to manage bibliographies and references when writing essays and articles. His session also included the significance of research in teaching. The faculty members asked questions about choosing research topic, time management for research and proposed some ideas for promoting research in the Faculty.

Dr. Faisal expressed his views about the team work and leadership significance in an organization. An interactive session about sharing experiences in teaching was also included. Senior faculty members shared their experiences while teaching at BUITEMS. Dr. Sadiq Bugti conducted a session about perceptions and their impact in human life. Theme of his talk was how negative perceptions can ruin the working environment of an organization. Dr. Riaz gave an introduction of learning management system. He demonstrated one of the course management systems, Moodle and recommended it as a tool for course and time management.

Mr. Marjan gave a lecture about "Who is best teacher in student's perspective". He discussed the qualities of a good teacher. Faculty members also shared tips for effective teaching. Interactive activities and sharing was part of the training objectives as well. The interaction brought forth the hidden skills of teachers such as their poetic talent and drawing abilities.

TELS Workshop

Transforming English Language Skills in Higher Education Pakistan (TELS-HEP) was the pilot phase of a project which aimed to transform English language skills in Higher

Education in Pakistan. It was an innovative collaboration between 12 universities, the HEC, the British Council and The Open University UK. The pilot roll-out phase lasted for one year, from September 2012-July 2013.

TELS HEP attempted to implement a major institutional change process by authoring and rolling out English Language and Professional Development modules that emphasize interactive, reflective, collaborative and student-centered learning and teaching. However, the process has placed considerable pressure on institutions and particularly on Master Trainers (MT's) tasked with responsibility for making the changes happen.

In this connection a Monitoring & Review Workshop was organized by HEC and British Council, on February 23, 2013, to scale the success of the project, and to encompass the suggestions and recommendations from the master trainers. Miss Sadiqa Ramzan Ali represented BUITEMS. During the workshop the MT's shared very rewarding experiences.



In this regard, a one week workshop was organised by British Council for revision of the modules. The workshop was held at Lahore from 2nd-6th September, 2013. Miss Sadiqa Ramzan Ali (Co-author of the Modules) joined the team of authors for revision and editing. The week dedicated for revision and editing yielded positive results, as the authors worked hard, proof read and sorted out the incongruities, and completed the tasks appropriately.

BEEC organized a three day workshop on September 19-21, 2013 on gender abuse and measures for its control.

Finally, an agreement signing ceremony was held on September 12, 2013 at HEC Islamabad where JICA Chief Mr. Kawasaki and Vice Chancellor BUITEMS, Ahmed Farooq Bazai formally signed an agreement for the implementation of the project 'In-country Training and Provision of Engineering Equipment to BUITEMS'. This project will mark a new beginning of quality engineering education in Balochistan. BUITEMS, with the support of JICA, will be a forerunner in revolutionizing the higher education spectrum to bring it at par with international standards.

'Universities in the Islamic World: Challenges of Internationalization,' was the topic probed in the 2-day Vice Chancellors' Forum on

September 23-24, 2013; organized by COMSATS Islamabad in collaboration with the Islamic Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (ISESCO); Higher Education Commission, Pakistan (HEC); Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of Pakistan (MoST); and the Federation of the Universities of the Islamic World (FUIW).

> The specific objectives set forth for the Forum were to help establish linkages and promote networking among the participating HEI's while promoting collaboration through scholarships for higher studies, students and faculty exchange and, establishment of virtual centers of excellence.

The Vice Chancellor BUITEMS, Ahmed Farooq Bazai, also participated in the Forum. The Forum was designed around thought provoking sessions on the possibilities and challenges of internationalization, particularly in the Muslim world. Moreover, the heads of all HEI's were invited to contemplate over the ideas of higher education leadership in a globalizing world, transnational education, faculty and student exchange, policy reforms aimed at internationalization and unifying the HEI's in the Islamic world. Interesting perspectives about the dilemma of passive approach to research and a general lag in development and advancement in the Muslim world, were brought on table

and the idea that academicians can bring these countries closer to each other in the long-term relations more effectively than the democrats or politicians, was seeded in the minds of these visionary academic leaders.

Being the prolific opportunity as it was, the summit of the heads of renowned HEI's of the Muslim world ended in promises of enhancing cooperation. The feasibility of scholarships and collaborative research is not only under consideration, but these Universities and Institutions are taking it in as an essential consideration.
