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Editorial

In an era when government is placing unprecedented emphasis on research as a key factor for driving the knowledge society and economy, the effective management of research has become a key contemporary issue for institutions. The research "production" of an institution is crucial to its competitiveness and academic ranking; it is an increasingly important part of the overall resources that individual institutions have at their disposal.

Several inter-related factors in the external environment of BUITEMS present new challenges for research management: changes in funding regimes; new societal demands; changes in the practice of innovation and research; and expanding research links between the University, industry, commerce, government and the wider community. The normative imperative in any university should also become a favored site for publicly funded research. It is not surprising, then, to find BUITEMS is reflecting its keen and growing interest in the overall research capacity building.

Aspects of research management are of particular importance in the unique setting of BUITEMS. For research endeavors at the University, common themes relevant to higher education emerged as a) perpetuity in research training and research career development, and b) strengthening structures and processes for research management and support.

BUITEMS has been operationally geared and prepared to capitalize on these two themes by institutionalizing a multitude of efforts and policies. The first domain is the research training and career development, notably as an institutional responsibility. For the purpose BUITEMS is continuously involved in rethinking researcher education, through both initial and post graduate degrees so that students have the appropriate skills to adapt to the greater variety inherent in a research career.

The second operational research domain at BUITEMS revolves around growth of professionalization – of research management within the University, which involves the appointment of both academic and administrative staff to specific research management positions and upgrading the capabilities of staff throughout the institution to better manage research activities.

Structural research priorities identified by BUITEMS for itself concern increasing research funding, strengthening university research, promoting basic research, and organizational features of the research enterprise. Broad thematic challenges or disciplinary areas include women's participation, sustainable development, and specific technology areas. The remarkable convergence of thematic areas as delineated in lines above, has major implications for the University to reposition itself within a fast evolving landscape.

The objective of the Expo was to create an Astana Pavilion Village (APV) that will be set up in the shadow of World Heritage Makli necropolis, at Makli Goth, Thatta. The theme of the Expo was *"Energy for All"*.

The objective of the workshop was to share the knowledge on building sustainable structures using local renewable materials and vernacular techniques for 21st century architecture. The students from BUITEMS learnt on the proficiency of zero/low carbon footprint structures that are based on sustainable materials i.e. earth/clay, lime and bamboo, thus reducing carbon footprint of construction, especially for large-scale housing in the rural areas and building hybrid structures in urban centres. Students also analysed zero/low carbon shelter structures, which are flood resistant and thus Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) complainants. The students' professional knowledge and outstanding efforts led to the adequate implementation of structures at the site. The interaction between Architecture students from different universities of Pakistan under the supervision of senior and experienced Architects provided students with valuable learning opportunities and exposure to sharpen and hone their knowledge and professional skills.


On February 7, 2017, Fluxicon declared BUITEMS

ISO 9001:2015 and Processes on Improvement for Quality Assurance at IBA main campus Karachi on February 21, 2017. The purpose of the seminar was to create awareness on ISO 9001-2015 standards Six Sigma Methodology; its significance and implementation in universities. ISO 9001-2015 specifies requirements for a quality management system when an organization needs to demonstrate its ability to consistently provide services that meet all stake holders' requirements, and aims to enhance performance through effective application of the system. It also includes processes for improvement of the system and the assurance of conformity to customer and applicable statutory and regulatory requirements.
